

Teresa Fanego works as a Full Professor of English Language and Linguistics at the University of Santiago de Compostela. She studied Germanic Philology in Santiago de Compostela and specialized (1975-1976) in English Linguistics at University College London. In 1978 she completed her doctorate on “Linguistic Variants in Seventeenth and Eighteenth Century Editions of Shakespeare” (Extraordinary PhD Award, Faculty of Philosophy and Letters). In 1984 she was appointed Associate Professor of English in Santiago de Compostela and since May 1990 she holds the chair in English Language and Linguistics.

Most of her published work has been on the English of Shakespeare and his contemporaries and on various aspects of English historical syntax, including sentential complement constructions and the expression of motion events. More generally, she is interested in grammaticalization processes and in functional and cognitive models of grammar.

Since the 1990s Teresa Fanego has been the director of the research unit for *Variation, Linguistic Change and Grammaticalization*, based at Santiago de Compostela. Over the years the unit has received funding from the European Regional Development Fund, the Regional Government of Galicia, and the Spanish National Research Plan (grants PB90-0370, PB94-0619, PB97-0507, BFF2001-2914, HUM2004-00940, HUM2007-60706, FFI2011-26693-C02-01 and FFI2014-52188-P). Students who have successfully completed their PhDs within the unit and currently hold positions at professorial or senior-lecturer level include, among many others, J.
